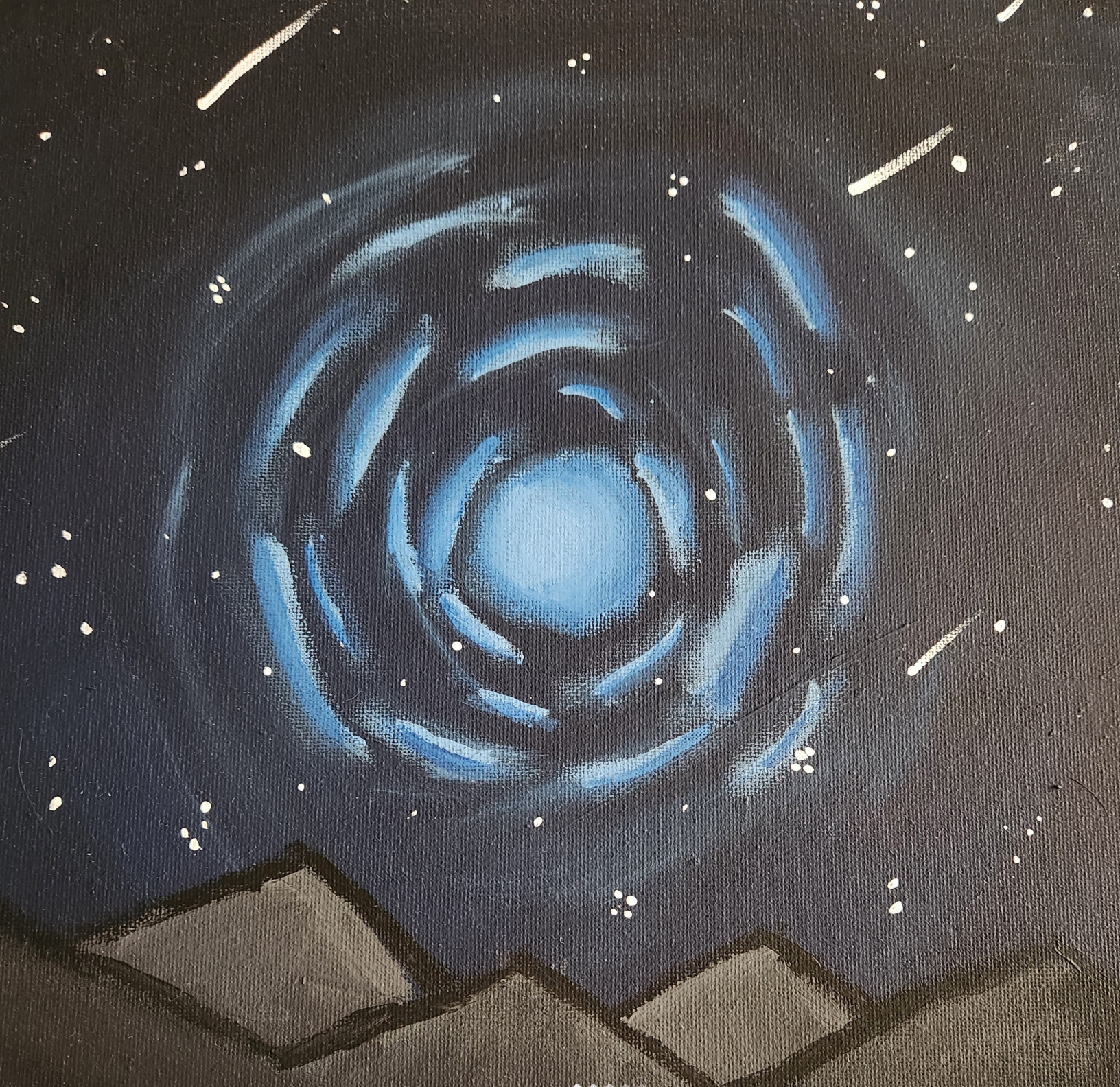

MISSION IMPACT REPORT

FY 2025-2026

FROM CHILDHOOD TO ADULthood

Since 1996, OUT Maine's goal has been to support and empower LGBTQIA2S+ youth by creating welcoming and affirming communities statewide. **But our work doesn't stop when kids age out of programs.**

In FY 2025-2026 we piloted a workforce development program for the first time, with a goal of supporting young adults who had "graduated" from our youth programs and were now entering the professional world. We hired two Program Assistants to this end: **Alphie and Dani**. Their jobs would be to support the programming team with current events and programs, stepping in to facilitate and lead youth when needed.

Both had personally participated in OUT Maine programming as youth. That firsthand perspective proved invaluable immediately, as they took the initiative to facilitate our weekly online group Fruit Loops for ages 9-13, relaunched the teen version of that group for ages 14-18 (aptly renamed Queerios), and even developed and implemented their own original and multigenerational program for the summer, Close Knit.

Alphie first attended OUT Maine programs when they were just 13 years old. They attended the ever-popular Rainbow Ball Weekend while in high school, returned as a volunteer, and served on our Youth Advisory Board. Now, a decade after that first interaction, they're bringing fresh ideas, advocating for accessibility, and effectively engaging with youth throughout our programs.

Dani has also engaged with OUT Maine for years, volunteering at both Rainbow Ball Weekend and our partnered Haystack Mountain School of Crafts' Studio Art Weekend. He was a part of the Youth Advisory Board, where we were able to watch his facilitation and leadership skills grow into adulthood. As a Program Assistant he has been eager to implement new ideas to constantly improve our program offerings.

"I feel really grateful to be working here with such a wonderful team and supporting our youth.," says Dani. "Giving them safe spaces to connect and express themselves is beyond rewarding. Making a difference in their lives, supporting the development of their social/ emotional skills, and getting to witness their creativity are such a pleasure. It feels so healing to be providing these kiddos with resources and support that I didn't always have access to but so desperately needed in my youth."

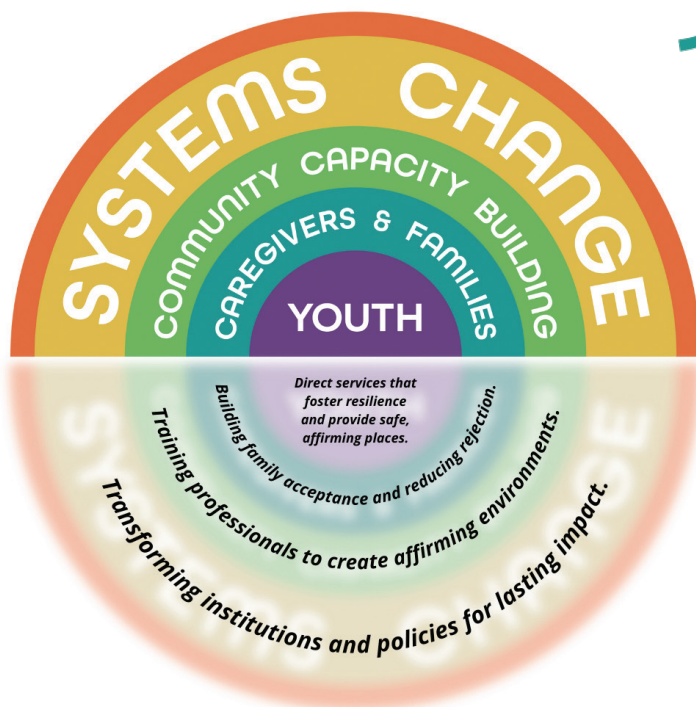
THEORY OF CHANGE

Both Alphie and Dani are prime examples of **youth in Maine who reached out for support, and then upon receiving it, turned around and spread those lessons learned and feelings of belonging to more queer and trans youth throughout the state.** That's what our work is all about. We're exceedingly proud of them and honored to be able to watch their lives and careers grow over time. In fact, their stories have inspired us to start a new branch of work: the **OUT Maine Alumni Network**, meant for anyone 19 or older who has participated in an OUT Maine program as a youth and wants to continue engaging with our mission while professionally networking with other LGBTQIA2S+ and allied adults.

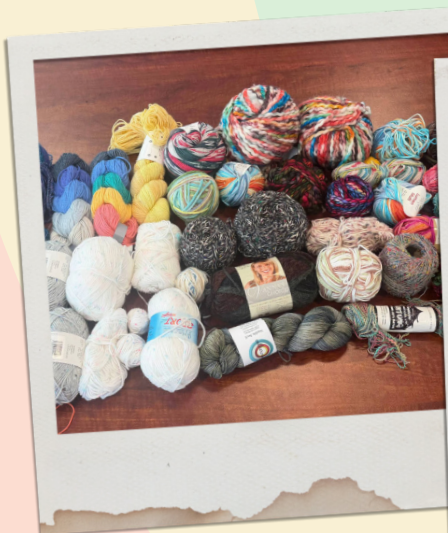
Youth thrive when they feel safe, supported, and celebrated.

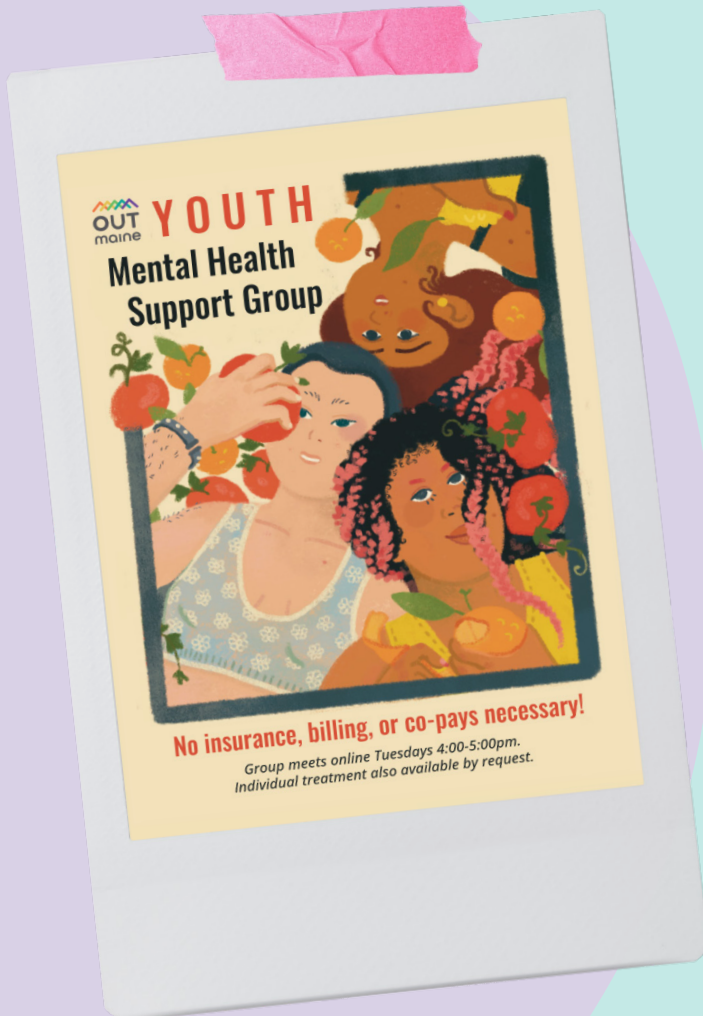
CLOSE KNIT

Close Knit is OUT Maine's newest all ages, textile-centric, remote crafting group spearheaded by Program Assistants Dani and Alphie! After seeing a need for a safe and creativity-focused multigenerational group, Dani and Alphie developed Close Knit as part of OUT Maine's summer programming. They brought in guest speakers and instructors for mini-lessons on the basics of knit and crochet, and then lead sessions on the history of craftivism. The program fosters a positive social environment where folks also had the opportunity to contribute to a joint philanthropic project, chosen by participants.

If any participants had trouble accessing materials to do their own crafts at home, OUT Maine was able to send them supplies for free as a result of the generosity of multiple yarn and craft stores! Pictured below is just a portion of the mountain of materials donated to get this program off the ground in FY 25-26, in preparation of running it through summer 2026.



MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORTS



As of January 2026, OUT Maine has been able to offer clinical mental health counseling services for LGBTQIA2S+-identifying or questioning youth in Maine ages 13-22! This is a grant-funded pilot program. These services are facilitated by OUT Maine's on-staff licensed mental health clinician (LCPC) and are HIPAA compliant. **Individual counseling services** are available for youth ages 13-22, as well as a **weekly online support group** for ages 13-18. The programs are additionally staffed by practicum students from the University of Southern Maine's clinical counseling program. Best of all, both the group counseling program and individual therapy sessions are 100% FREE for participants and their families. That means no insurance, billing, or co-pays necessary at any time. **It's important that mental health support is accessible to all, and OUT Maine is committed to seeing that through.**

OUT Maine received over 40 requests for mental health support services from youth across the state during the fiscal year, which far exceeded the capacity of the pilot program. Now, we're exploring new avenues for future expansion of these services to meet the needs of queer and trans youth here in Maine.

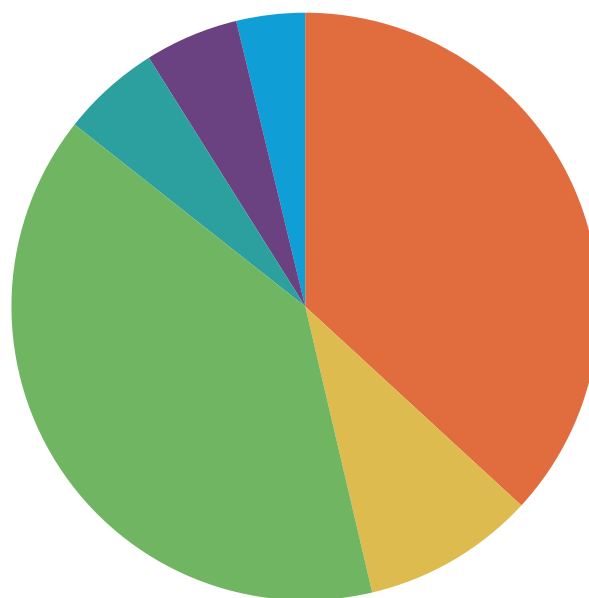
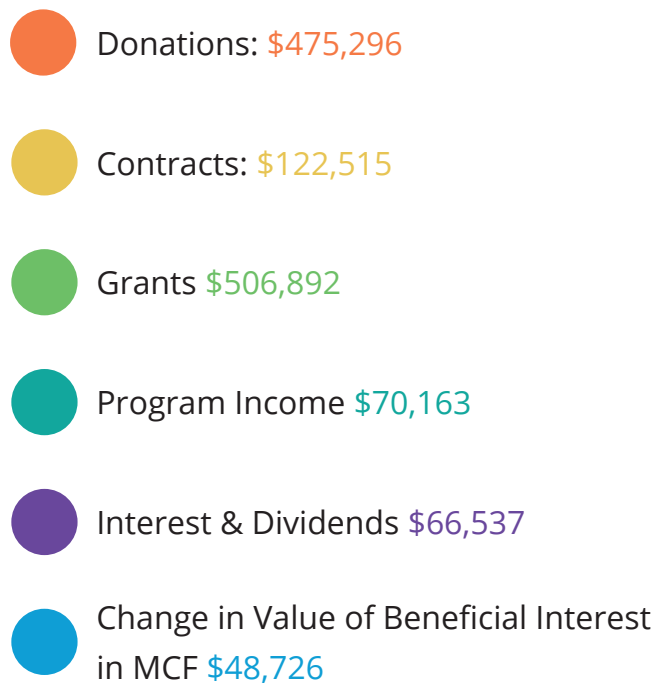

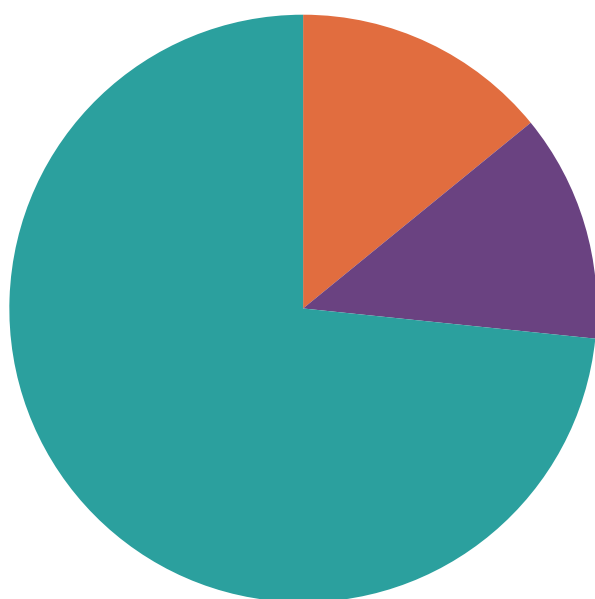

Expenses \$1,116,092

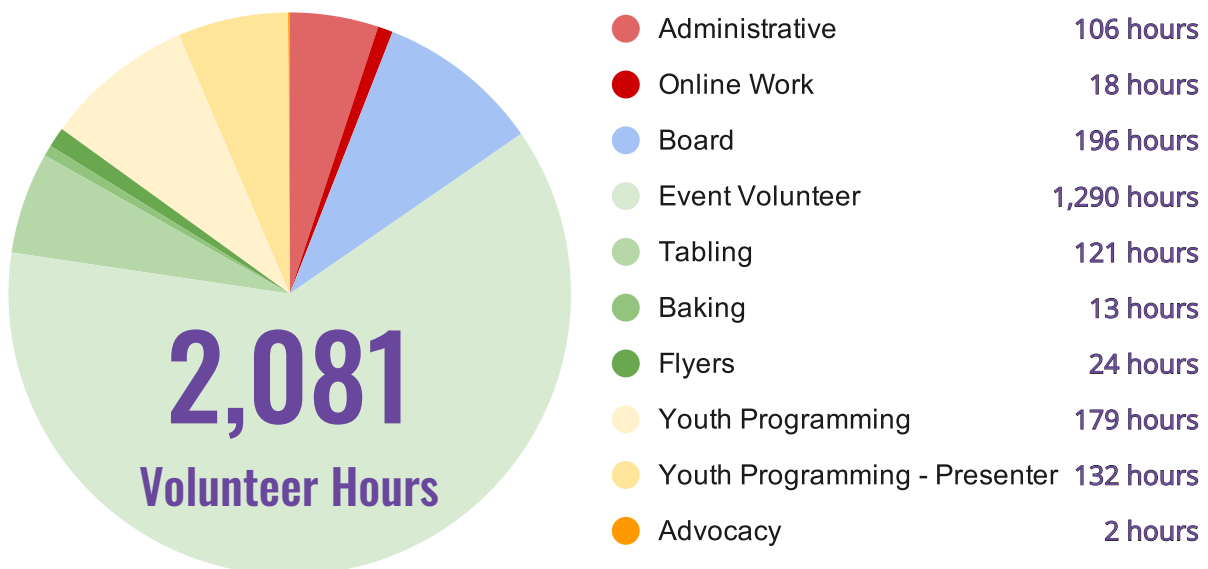

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

OUT Maine's board members advise, govern, support, and promote OUT Maine's mission, programs, and organizational needs. The board is legally and fiscally responsible for the organization. Board members serve 3-year terms, with a limit of two consecutive terms.



STRATEGIC PLAN

We developed a five-year Strategic Plan in 2024. Our focus has been dedicated to achieving three overarching goals by June 2029:

1. Establish and implement a comprehensive, multi-tiered support framework that enhances inclusivity and fosters a safe, affirming environment for LGBTQ+ youth, parents, and families through targeted programming and systemic transformations across organizational structures.
2. Enhance OUT Maine's capacity by implementing targeted staff development programs, technological infrastructure upgrades, and strategic partnerships to expand the organization's outreach and impact within the LGBTQ+ community across the state.
3. Strengthen OUT Maine's financial sustainability and resilience by diversifying funding sources with an emphasis on developing and nurturing strategic partnerships with key stakeholders, both private and public.
